Author Last name, Author First Name. *Title of Book*. City of Publication: Publisher, Year of Publication. Medium of Publication.

Internet Site

Author Last Name, Author First Name. *Title of the Section*. *Title of overall Web site* (if different than title of work). Publisher of site (if not available use N.p.), Day Month Year of publication (if no date available use n.d.). Medium of publication. Day Month Year of Access. <electronic address>.

Research Databases

For Databases like *World Book*

Author Last name, Author First Name. "Title of the article." *Name of Database*. Day Month Year of Access. <Electronic address of the source>.

Research Databases

For databases that are collections of newspaper and magazine articles, or works published in other print sources; you need to include the original publication information in the citation. (*Points of View, EBSCOHost, NewsBank, Oxford, Most CML Databases, etc.*)

Author Last name, Author First Name. "Title of the article." *Title of Original Publication* Date of publication: page numbers. *Name of Database*. Day Month Year of Access. <Electronic address of the source>.

Example:

Flannery, Mary Ellen. "Better School Libraries Mean Better Scores, Florida Education Officials Learn" *The Miami Herald* 1 Mar. 2004: A17. *Points of View Reference Center*. Web. 11 Jan. 2008. <<http://search.ebscohost.com/login.aspx?authtype=uid>>.
