Once you have received the parent letter with your student's specific information, please verify and update your Contact Information prior to attending PAW Days August 16 and 17. You will still need to verify information (even if there are no updates) in order to participate in PAW Days.

Computers will be available at PAW Days, however visiting Home Access prior to PAW Days will substantially speed up your process. Managing Your Child's School Meal Account Just Got Easier



Hilliard City Schools is now offering automated prepayments to your child's meal account via the telephone or internet. Simply dial in or log on and use a credit card to fund your child's meal account. All at your convenience – from home, car, office or on the road. It couldn't be easier!

With *Mealpay* you can:

- Prepay with your VISA, Mastercard, or Discover credit card or a check
- Access your child's account 24/7
- Not worry about lost or stolen money.

Getting started ...

1. Simply log on to www.mealpayplus.com
2. Click on the "Register" button, then create your personal profile. (After completing each step of the registration process, click the "Next" button at the lower right corner of the web site.)
3. After creating your personal profile, you will create your username and password.
4. Select the state (OH) and school district (Hilliard.)
5. Enter your child's Student ID number, which can be found on their Student ID card, or their class schedule.

NOTE: Some buildings add the student's graduating year to the beginning of the ID number on their Student ID card (ex. 090012456). Graduation year and leading zeros are NOT part of their Student ID number. In the example given, the student ID number would be 12456.

1. After selecting the student, you will be asked to confirm your profile. When the registration process is finished, you will be sent a confirmation email with a link back to *Mealpay*. After you receive the confirmation email, you can log on to the *Mealpay* website and make a payment on your child's account using their secure website, or call (877)-237-0946 and pay over the phone. *

* A 4.75% fee will apply for each transaction.

ATTENDANCE UPDATES

Attendance: 921-7511

The Hilliard City Schools have entered into a relationship with the Franklin County Educational Service Center (FCESC) in an effort to address student unexcused absences to school. The following procedures will be in place for unexcused absence to school totals:

- 3 Days of unexcused absence – a warning letter will be sent home
- 4 Days of unexcused absence – administrator will personally contact parents/guardian
- 5 Days of unexcused absence – a referral will be made to the FCESC truancy intervention officers.

There will be three types of absences from school: Official Absence (verified appointment, school business, etc.), Absence (personal illness, illness in family, etc.) and Unexcused Absence (Truant).

A student will receive an F in a class if he/she accumulates more the 6 (six) total class absences, excused or unexcused, during any nine-week grading period. Official absences will not count in this total. It is very important that parents/guardians play a positive role in their student's school attendance. By keeping an open line of communication we can continue to

help students achieve at the highest level. Making sure to support positive attendance habits is critical to student achievement.

TARDIES TO SCHOOL

Any student arriving to school after the beginning of first period is considered tardy to school. The attendance office will record a tardy, regardless of the reason, as a tardy. All tardies, excused or unexcused will count toward disciplinary action, excluding official absences.

If a written note from a parent is presented with a valid reason for tardy (see the Student Handbook for types of tardies), the tardy will be considered excused and the student will be allowed to make up any missed work. However, the student will still be considered tardy.

Students having excessive tardies to school, excused or unexcused, will be disciplined as follows:

- 4 tardies per grading period = Wednesday School Assignment
- 8 tardies per grading period = Saturday School Assignment
- 12 tardies per grading period = 2 Saturday School Assignment
- 16 & subsequent tardies per grading period = School suspension

Oversleeping and transportation issues are not "excused" reasons!



DRESS CODE REMINDERS

The Hilliard City Schools student dress code is listed in the Student Handbook that each student will receive on the first day of school. Dress code rules are provided to help insure the health, welfare and safety of all students as well as enhancing the positive image of all students and their school. Listed below are some reminders from the dress code that we would ask each family to review.

The following items are prohibited:

- Extremely short shorts
- Tube tops and spaghetti straps
- Halters/off the shoulder tops
- Bare midriffs
- Bare feet
- Clothing with profane, violent, suggestive, racially intimidating or offensive pictures and/or lettering
- Clothing that advertise or bears the logo of alcohol, drug, or tobacco products
- Hats, scarves or head coverings (except for religious reasons)
- Muscle shirts
- Sagging pants and shorts
- Inappropriate or unsafe footwear
- In addition, coats and backpacks may be worn/brought to school but are to be left in the student's locker during the school day.



NO BOOK BAGS DURING SCHOOL!

Students are not permitted to use book bags during the school day at Heritage. Students are permitted to carry book bags to and from school. Thanks in advance for your cooperation.

USE OF ELECTRONIC DEVICES

Personal cell phones and other electronic devices may be used in the classroom for their technological advantages under the supervision and guidance of the instructor as it pertains to the lesson being taught. Cell phones should be turned off and kept secure in back packs when not being used under the supervision of an instructor. The school district is not responsible for the loss of cell phones or personal electronic devices if parents elect to have their child bring one to school in their back pack.

Any phone or electronic device will be subject to confiscation if it creates a disruption to the academic environment. A student using an electronic device which creates a disruption or refusing to follow a reasonable request from a staff member pertaining to the phone or device may be subject to disciplinary action. Staff will be the final judge of the appropriateness of their use. Using a cellular phone or an electronic device to film/record/take pictures of any student or staff member is prohibited.

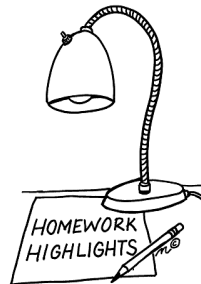

IS IT TIME TO CHANGE YOUR eNews SUBSCRIPTION?

Is your child transitioning to a new school for the 2011-12 school year? Do you want to stay up to date on important district news as well as what's going on in your student's school? Then sign-up for any of Hilliard City Schools' 24 eNews listserve. A listserve is an email subscription that you subscribe to much like a magazine. You control your account and can make adjustments, such as changing your school subscription or adding a subscription for the district-wide eNews. Once you complete the simple registration process, you will receive information about the specific school straight to your in-box. Simply visit the district's website at <http://hilliardschools.org/news/mailList.cfm> and follow the simple instructions.

HOMEWORK CLUB

Homework Club is a program designed to increase homework completion and help students enhance academic success. Students who miss homework assignments will be assigned to the Homework Club and be given an opportunity at lunch to work under the supervision of a staff member. Students will stay in the Homework Club for their entire lunch period, hopefully completing the assignment. Students are allowed to bring their lunch from home to Homework Club, or a brown bag lunch can be ordered and purchased from the cafeteria.



Classroom teachers in periods 1-3 will check for homework completion during class. For each student who does not have their homework completed; they will be issued a Homework Club slip for the student to attend Homework Club that day. Class periods 4-7 will follow the same procedure with the student attending Homework Club the following day.

Instead of going to lunch, students will bring their Homework Club slip which was given to them by the teacher who assigned the homework, along with the assignment to the designated room. HMS staff members will monitor each student's progress in Homework Club. During the period, students will work to complete the homework and eat lunch.

The work the student completes during lunch is attached to the Homework Club slip and returned to the teacher's mailbox. If the assignment is not completed during lunch, the student can be assigned again for the next day.

Reminder:

1. Students will be given a minimum of 50% credit for assignments completed during Homework Club.
2. Students accumulating multiple assignments to Homework Club each grading period will receive additional consequences as follows:
 - 4 days = Wednesday School
 - 8 days = Saturday School
 - 12 days = Saturday School
 - 16 days = 1 day In-school Suspension
 - Additional consequences for every 4 days in Homework Club.
3. Students who are unexcused absent to an assigned Homework Club will be assigned a 30 minute after school detention. Parents will be notified via the school's auto phone dialer.
4. Parents can check their student's Homework Club attendance via the Home Access system.

Library Media Center Information

Textbook Distribution

All textbooks have been bar-coded and are part of the Library Media Center (LMC) automated circulation system. Textbooks can be picked up in the Media Center on PAW Days. Some classes may not offer a textbook. Any textbook a student receives at check out will be the copy for which they are responsible. Students should write their first and last name on the inside cover of each textbook that has been checked out to them.



We prefer that students avoid using the stretchy book covers on textbooks as they tend to cause more damage than they offer protection. Paper book covers are available through the school store or you can opt to use paper grocery bags.

If a parent or student has a question about the status of a textbook or library book, they can access their LMC account online or contact Miss Miller for assistance.

Student ID Cards

All Heritage Middle School students will be issued a student ID card during PAW Days. Students are required to have their HMS Student ID cards for a number of reasons, including the check out of textbooks and other Library Media Center materials. If a student is unable to attend PAW Days, he or she can obtain a temporary ID card from the LMC to use until a regular ID card is issued. If an ID card is lost, the first replacement card is free. If a second replacement is needed, the cost will be \$1.00. All subsequent lost ID cards will cost \$5.00.



Library Media Specialist

The Library Media Center will have a new face behind the desk this year. Miss Miller has spent the past twelve years as the media specialist at Hilliard Crossing Elementary. She is excited about the opportunity to work with older students and has already begun adding color to the facility.

Traffic Pattern at Heritage

In order to improve our traffic flow before and after school, as well as increase student safety, we would like to remind everyone of our drop off/pick up locations for both buses and those parents transporting students to/from school.

Hilliard City School buses will be loading and unloading while parked in the access road/bus loop behind Heritage Middle School. From 7:00-7:30 AM and 2:00-2:30 PM, this area will be closed to all other traffic.

Parents and others who will be transporting students to and from school should use the parking lot in front of school only. Please use the parking lot entrance directly across from Municipal Park and not nearest Memorial Middle School to access that front lot. The north end of the front parking lot of Heritage will also be used for the bus drop off and pickup of our Special Needs students.

We will have staff members and other volunteers stationed near school entrances and exits the first few days

of school to help facilitate traffic flow.

Please take time to review your transportation route and plan ahead to help accommodate our traffic flow. A map is included on the reverse side of this letter to aid you in making plans.

The administration of both Heritage Middle School and the District Transportation office feel this traffic pattern helps ease confusion and congestion in our parking lots and be safer for our students. Thanks in advance for your help and cooperation.

Arrival Procedures To School

7:10 A.M. – Breakfast available in cafeteria. Students with a breakfast pass may exit off their bus & enter the cafeteria to eat. You may acquire a breakfast pass at the register during your lunch period. All other students will wait outside the building until 7:20 a.m.

7:20 A.M. – Students will be dismissed from the busses and cafeteria to go to their lockers. Dropped off students and walkers can enter the building.

7:30 A.M. – Students are to be in their 1st period classes and attendance will be taken. Students arriving after 7:30 a.m. will be considered tardy and need to sign in at the main office.

Drop-off Students/Walkers will enter the main entrance at the front of the building.

Bus Students will enter the back of the building.

Parents who are dropping students off to school:

- Do not block the entrance/exit to the parking lot
- Pull your vehicle forward to the furthest spot along the front sidewalk
- For your student's safety, all students exit the vehicle on the right hand side onto the sidewalk

- **DRIVE CAUTIOUSLY**, especially when driving in the second lane, passing cars that are parked along the sidewalk

- For their safety, **DO NOT** drop your student off in the parking lot to walk across traffic
- Parking along the curb is not permitted. The curb must be open for drop offs only. If you would like to have your child wait in the car until the building opens, please park in a spot in the parking lot and then join the line along the curb when you are ready for your child to be dropped off.

Dismissal Procedures From School

2:10 P.M. – Students will be dismissed **Pick-up Students/Walkers** will exit the main entrance at the front of the building

Bus Students will exit the back of the building

All students are expected to leave the premises by **2:30 p.m.** unless attending an after school activity or arrangements have been made with a staff member for the student to be under their supervision

ALL STUDENTS MUST BE UNDER AN APPROVED ADULTS SUPERVISION DURING AFTER SCHOOL HOURS.

Parents are responsible for making these arrangements for their children

Parents who are picking up students:

- Do not block the entrance/exit to the parking lot

- Pull your vehicle forward to the furthest spot along the front sidewalk

- For students' safety, **DO NOT** park in the parking spaces and have your child walk across traffic to your car

For students' safety, all students will enter the vehicle on the right hand side of the car from the sidewalk.



RENAISSANCE PROGRAM 2011-2012

Renaissance is a nationwide program that rewards students for academic excellence, good attendance and behavior. Heritage Middle School is proud to continue the tradition of Renaissance recognitions in Hilliard. Students that meet the requirements listed below at the end of the nine weeks will receive a Renaissance Gold or Blue card for the following nine weeks. - One Homework Pass (within a nine week period)
- Half price admission to home athletic events
- Special discount coupons when available
- Invitation to hear Guest Speakers when scheduled

Cards will be issued two weeks into the start of each nine-weeks based upon the previous nine-weeks performance.

Attendance Petition Policy:

Students who do not receive a Renaissance card because of the attendance policy may petition to waive the attendance requirements. Official documentation must be included with an explanation of the absences to the assistant principal within the first two weeks of the grading period from a parent or guardian.

2012 Entertainment Books Are Coming!

On Friday, September 2, 2011, we will kick off our 2011-2012 Entertainment Book Sale. The proceeds from this sale will benefit our students and staff through the many recognition programs and building initiatives that are planned throughout the school year. All three Hilliard middle schools will again be participating in this effort to continue a tradition of excellence.

The Heritage Middle School staff has looked at a variety of fundraisers with the object of again providing families with great value. We are happy to continue our relationship with One for Community Programs that uses Entertainment Books as a fund generator for local schools.

Many families have purchased Entertainment Books in the past. We hope that you will consider purchasing from Heritage students or staff. We are not asking students to go door to door. We are attempting to make this project more of a service to our families. The process will be as follows:

On September 2 we will have a kickoff presentation to explain the program and

give the students the option to participate. If they decide to participate, they will be given an envelope with information and one Entertainment Book. The student will take the book home for the family to review. The student then has several options:



1. Sell the book to the family. Cost is \$25.00.
2. Show the book to friends and relatives. Collect \$25.00 from anyone else who wants a book. Bring the money to school and we will give the student a book for each order.
3. Buy as a gift or sell to relatives in other cities – a book in their area will be sent to them.
4. Decide not to purchase and return the book and envelope to school starting September 5.
5. Elect not to participate. Do not pick up a book and envelope during the kickoff on September 2

Your family can benefit greatly by purchasing the Entertainment Book. It is filled with hundreds of half-off and two-for-one coupons that can be used throughout the area. The Book is valid until November 1, 2012.

Students who participate are eligible for a variety of prizes including a cash prize to the #1 and #2 seller in each grade. There will also be several prize drawings throughout the sale for those students who sell at least one Entertainment Book.

This sale is again provided as a service to our families and is strictly voluntary. By purchasing during our sale you can begin using the book immediately.
